- **Psychiatry and pediatric psychiatry and the environment.** How can the position of psychiatry be strengthened in prevention? How can/should psychiatry co-operate with the psychologists, teachers, volunteers, police, churches, and other staff?
- **Psychiatry: Depression, Anxiety and Suicide.** Early intervention in schizophrenia for suicide prevention Section for psychiatrists, pediatric psychiatrists.
- **Survivor organizations.** Tasks and possibilities. How to help the survivors? How to help the parents, how to help the family? Possibilities of students and teachers?
- **School violence and suicidology** (Alienation, Revenge, Redemption).
